First Witness for Prosecution
Maj. C.C. Hill, 9 CIB Sp. Sp. (C.H. 80.) sworn, states

On the 20 Dec 43 at approx. 1400 hrs. I was inspecting the car park with ~~the Transport Officer~~ ^{Sgt Wallace} I saw ~~the car~~ ^{Sgt Wallace} enter the gate - I noted a vehicle requiring repairs - I called Sgt Wallace sent to the Transport Office - he was flushed, unsteady, swaying from side to side - it was obvious he had been drinking. He accused, admitted having three beers at the pub. I had him placed ~~in~~ ⁱⁿ Open Arrest. ~~At the~~ Sgt. Wallace had been brought from his quarters to the Transport Office - he was unable to stand properly to attention. His speech was thick.

Second Witness for Prosecution

Lieut. F. S. Stuckley, 9 CIB. (C.H. 10) sworn, states -
I was in the car park on the 20 Dec 43 at approx. 1430 hrs. with the 2/c Maj. Hill I was inspecting the Car Park. I saw Sgt Wallace enter the barracks grounds for the first time. The second time I saw him I approached him about a M.C. ~~from~~ ^{from} the Sgt. Office for Sgt. Wallace. When he reported at the Sgt. Office his speech was thick, he was unsteady on his feet, and his eyes were partially glazed.

Cross Exam. - Sgt. Wallace's place of duty was any place in the ~~camp~~ ^{camp} area.

Exam. by Court - The barracks, Sgt Office & Car Park are one mile distant from the garage. Sgt. Wallace's H.Q. is at the garage. His duty might take him to any of these places.

Upon evidence being read over, witness states "I did not question him about the M.C. but I ~~did~~ ^{did} ~~not~~ ^{did} question him."
