Renewal TIMBER LICENCE No. 376

By authority of the Indian Act and regulations for the disposal of timber from Indian Reserves and Indian Lands established by Order in Council, I hereby grant unto

licence to cut the merchantable timber

upon the following lands: Compton Island Indian Reserve No. 6 - 139 acres

from 1 May 19 53 to 30th April, 19 54 and no longer; together with the

right to enter on and use the said lands as necessary for the removal of the timber.

This licence is subject to the provisions of the Indian Act and regulations and to the following terms which are accepted by the licensee.

1. The right to cut timber and the use of the lands is subject to the right of the Indians to occupy Reserve lands; and to any rights which may exist prior to the issue of this licence; and the use of roads and trails; and to the right to take timber for roads, bridges or public works.

2. The licensee agrees to pay annually ground rent of \$ 28.00 and a fee of \$10.00 for this licence and a renewal fee of \$5.00 for each renewal. And to cut the said timber, and pay dues thereon. Timber covered by this licence but left standing at the expiration of the licence, shall be scaled or otherwise measured and dues paid at the rate specified herein. ~~If the licensee is unable to remove the timber covered by this licence within the time specified in the licence, the licensee shall be liable to pay the dues on the timber so left standing at the rate specified herein.~~

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3. The licensee shall deposit \$100.00 as a guarantee that he will complete the purchase of this timber and to ensure the completion of the contract to the satisfaction of the Director of Indian Affairs. The licensee shall conduct his operations in an orderly manner so as to have consolidated at all times the cut and uncut portions of the area; and shall protect young trees from avoidable damage.

4. Camp sites shall be protected to prevent the starting and spreading of fires and the Director may require the licensee to provide fire fighting equipment. Slash and debris shall be disposed of according to practice in the Province so as to eliminate preventable fire hazard. The licensee shall be responsible for all costs of fire protection, including the cost of suppression of fires on the licensed area.

5. Except in British Columbia trees shall be cut within 12" of the ground. Saw timber shall be used to a 6" top and pulp wood to a 3" top. In British Columbia, the logging operation shall conform to the requirements of provincial statutes and regulations applicable to operations under Provincial Timber Licences.

6. On all timber cut less than the diameter limit; and on timber not taken to the usable limits, there shall be payable, as additional dues, stumpage at \$1.00 per tree.

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
