

A Yes.

Q You knew that a day school is impracticable - you know that?

A Yes.

Q And the only way they could be educated is at a boarding-school?

A That is right.

Q And if they don't get a boarding-school they will get no education?

A There is a boarding-school near Fort Fraser.

Q You mean Williams Lake, don't you?

A Yes, somewhere around there - at ~~Sage~~ ² Cequaletza School they have children coming ^{from} even as far as the Queen Charlotte Islands.

Q Do any of the children at Ulkatche attend any school now?

A Not to my knowledge.

Q And the effect of that is that there are about twenty children who are not going to any school and for whose education no provision is made?

A That is a fact.

Q I notice in the evidence in respect to the Bella Coola Indian Reserve Albert King says that arrangements have been made for the subdividing of the reserve and the giving of individual allotments and it is because they don't get the individual allotments that they are not making any use of the land - do you remember that?

A Yes.

Q Has anything been done about that?

A No.

Q It is in the same position yet?

A Yes.

Q Do you consider that the conditions there would be remedied by the giving of individual allotments to the Indians?

A Yes.

Q You have reported in that direction to the Department, have you?

A No, I have not mentioned it; I was thinking of taking it up this Fall.

MR COMMISSIONER McRENNA: The reserve was subdivided was it not?

A Yes, it was surveyed before I became agent. In Morrow's time it
