XXXVIII. It shall the duty of the Market Committee to establish some place within the City, to be called the Fish Market, which said Fish Market shall be subject to the same general regulations as the other Markets of the City.

XXXIX. That no horned cattle, calves, swine, sheep, horses, mares, geldings, or mules, or any one of them, brought into the City for sale, shall be sold or offered for sale within the said City, in any of the public streets or other places in the said City, before they have been to the Cattle Market, and the Market fees have been paid thereon.

XL. That all bread sold, or exposed for sale, in this City, shall be of the full weight of two pounds and four pounds respectively, for the small and large loaves, and the Chief of Police, when ordered by the Mayor, or Chairman of the Market Committee, shall, from time to time, examine the bakers' shops and carts, and shall seize and confiscate all loaves which may be found of light weight, and shall dispose of the same, under the direction of the Mayor, or Chairman of the said Committee.

XLI. That the Weights and Measures regulat- ing the weighing and measuring of all articles of produce or general consumption, or appli- cable to this By-Law, shall be the weights and measures as established by the Dominion Government.

XLII. That any person selling within the City of Winnipeg, milk, or any other article of food, adulterated with water, or any substance whatever, will be liable to prosecution for an infraction of this By-Law.

XLIII. Every person hawking milk in the City of Winnipeg, shall be considered as coming under the Hawkers' By-Law, and shall take out a li- cense as enacted therein.

SCHEDULE OF MARKET FEES.

XLV. That the lessee of each of the public Markets, or, should the fees not be leased, the Market Superintendent, shall be entitled to de- mand and receive the following fees, viz :

- 1. From the owner or driver of each sleigh, waggon or other vehicle in which there shall be any fresh meat, produce or other article or articles of provisions brought into any of the public markets for sale within the city, for a double team, the sum of..... 25 cts. For a single team, the sum of..... 15 cts.
- 2. From the owner or seller of any article or articles of provisions, or farm or garden produce brought by hand or in a basket, the sum of..... 05. cts.
- 3. From the owners or sellers of all animals driven to the cattle markets for sale, for every head of horned cattle, the sum of..... 15 cts. For every head of sheep, cattle or swine, the sum of..... 05 cts. For every horse, mare, gelding or mule, the sum of..... 25 cts.
- 4. From the owner or driver of any vehicle, carrying fire wood, lumber, shingles, or laths to be sold within the city, if drawn

- by two animals, the sum of..... 10 cts. If drawn by one animal..... 05 cts.
- 5. From the owner or driver of any vehicle carrying hay or straw to be sold within the city, for each load drawn by two animals, the sum of..... 15 cts. For each load drawn by one animal..... 05 cts.
- 6. From the Captain or owner of any vessel, boat, raft or craft of any description, bringing into the city hay or straw, grain feed or fodder for sale, for each ton, the sum of..... 10 cts.
- 7. From the Captain or owner of any vessel, boat, raft or craft of any descrip- tion, bringing into the city fire wood for sale, for every cord, thereof..... 08 cts.
- 8. From the owner or seller of any fire wood, rails or fence posts floated down the rivers for sale within the city, for each cord thereof, the sum of..... 08 cts.

WEIGH HOUSE FEES.

XLVI. The Lessee of each of the Public Weigh Scale or Weigh Houses shall be entitled to demand and receive from the seller of any article or thing weighed by the said Lessee or his assistant, or any of them, the following fees, which shall be in addition to all other market charges, viz :

- 1. For weighing every load of hay, straw or grain in bulk, when drawn by two animals, of the sum of..... 15 cts. When drawn by one animal, the sum of... 10 cts.
- 2. For measuring every load of fire wood, when drawn by two animals, the sum of... 10 cts. When drawn by one animal, the sum of... 07 cts.
- 3. For measuring wood when delivered on the premises of the purchaser, or on the banks of the rivers, within the city, two cords or under, the sum of..... 25 cts.
- 4. Five cords or over two cords, the sum of 35 cts.
- 5. Ten cords or over five cords, the sum of 40 cts.
- 6. Every additional cord over ten cords..... 03 cts
- 7. For weighing all articles, not ex- ceeding 50 pounds, the sum of..... 02 cts
- 8. Over 50 pounds, but not exceeding 100 pounds, the sum of..... 03 cts
- 9. Over 100 pounds, but not exceeding 150 pounds, the sum of..... 04 cts
- 10. Over 150 pounds, but not exceeding 200 pounds, the sum of..... 05 cts
- 11. Every additional 100 pounds or frac- tion thereof over 200 pounds, the sum of...02 cts
- 12. For measuring of every half-pint, pint, quart, gallon, half-gallon, bushel or fraction of a bushel, the sum of..... 02 cts
- 13. For weighing every living horned cattle, horse, mare, gelding or mule, the sum of..... 15 cts
- 14. For weighing every live calf, sheep or swine, the sum of..... 05 cts
- 15. For weighing every load of coal, the sum of..... 15 cts
- 16. For weighing every load of merchan- dise not otherwise enumerated herein, the sum of..... 20 cts
