Transient poor Bill and Impost Bill not agreed to by the Council.

A Message was received from the Council with the Bill entitled, An Ast for the Maintenance and Support of transient Poor, mained and disabled Seamen and Soldiers, and other distressed Persons, who have no fixed Place of Abode. Not agreed to. Also with the Bill intitled, An Ast to revive, alter and continue the several Laws relating to the Duties of Impost on Beer, Rum, and other distilled Spirituous Liquors, which Laws expired the Thirty First of December 1784. Not agreed to.

Petition of John Harris presented Mr. Smith presented a Petition from John Harris, relating to Piston Road, Ordered to lie on the Table.

Petition of Mr. Jessen presented.

Mr. Dight presented a Petition from D. Christopher Jessen, Esq., praying some Allowance for his Losses sustained during the late War, Ordered to lie on the Table.

The House having according to the Order of the Day proceeded to take into Consideration the Petitions on the Table.

Petition of John Sergant, read The Petition of John Sargent, Gauger at Shelburne was read, and thereupon resolved, That he be allowed the Sum of Forty Pounds, for his Service in that Office for the Year past.

The Petition of John Nevil, late Goaler, read and dismissed.

Petition of John Prince read The Petition of John Toler, late Tide Waiter at Halifax, was read, and deferred to a future Confideration.

The Petition of Arthur Goold, and John Newton, Esqrs; Collectors of Impost and Excise for the District of Halifax, recommended to the Consideration of the House by his Excellency the Governor, was received, and Ordered to lie on the Table for the Inspection of the Members.
