GRAPE JUICE URGED.
W.C.T.U. Presses Claims Upon Anglican Clergymen.
NEW YORK, Oct. 27.—The convention of the World's Women's Christian Temperance Union adopted a resolution Saturday requesting the house of bishops of the Protestant Episcopal Church to "consider the propriety" of using unfermented wine at the communion sacrament in place of fermented wine, "which contains the narcotic poison alcohol."
The resolution was a substitute for one originally offered setting forth that fermented wine "could not truly represent the blood of Christ."
This phrase was objected to by English delegates, who declared that it would antagonize the Church of England. The English delegates also objected to an amendment declaring that "Jesus commanded unfermented wine in the holy communion."
Accused Trial To End Life.
MONTREAL, Oct. 27.—Charles Paul, C.E., 59 years old, charged with misappropriation of money entrusted to him by foreiguers, attempted suicide by cutting his throat yesterday while en route to police headquarters under arrest. Paul was treated at a hospital and later locked up.
Laborers employed on the Transcontinental Railway allege that Paul was given money to forward to Italy. The money never reached its destination, they claim.
Noted German Dead.
BERLIN, Oct. 27.—Privy Councilor Ludwig Max Goldberger, the well-known capitalist and economist, died at his residence in Berlin Friday evening, aged 65 years. The immediate cause of death was arterio-sclerosis, combined with heart disease.
