### Wilde Elected in Belmont.

Council—Ketchen, Anderson, McConnell and Brackenridge.

The election in Belmont and Methuen resulted in the return of A. A. Wilde for reeve over Wm. Griffith by a majority of 66.

For Councillors, Jss. Ketchen headed the poll, and the other three successful candidates are Messrs. T. McConnell, Wm. Anderson and J. F. Breckenridge.

The plebiscite on the commutation of statute labor was snowed under by a majority of 121, due no doubt to the meagre information on the subject among the ratepayers, who as a body are not aware of the largely increased grants attainable from the Provincial and Federal Governments under commuted statute labor. Old Havelock was the only one that favored the project. Doubtless the matter will be taken up later when more details of the benefits to be derived are explained to the electors.

### Joyce Elected Reeve for 1912

Kindred, Howe, Garratt and Jones for Council.

Election day on Monday was a strenuous one in Havelock. From the moment the poll opened until it closed the candidates and their supporters worked like Trojans to get the vote out. The result when the ballots were counted was a sweeping victory for S. S. Joyce for the reeveship, defeating Edw. Fennell by a majority of 58.

The only two members of the old Council in the campaign, fell by the wayside, the electors evidently determining to have a complete new slate for the year. Of the new men, Dr. Kindred headed the poll, but the other three all polled a large vote.

For school trustees, Job Coon won in a walk, with ex-trustee Falkner and Wesley Jackson tailing in closely behind. The following is the result of the poll.
