A sad and terrible suicide. A young woman of Elm Hills cut her throat with a razor.

The country for miles around was shocked last Saturday morning by the report that a daughter of Mr. Richard Tackabery, a well-to-do farmer residing a mile and a half south of Elm Hills, had committed suicide by cutting her throat with a razor.

Mrs. Tackabery was in the 24th year of her age, and was a sister of a young girl who died about a year ago of general good health.

During the past few months she has been subject to occasional fits of melancholy, and was at times out of her mind, but as she was very quiet during these attacks, the family did not consider it necessary to send her to an asylum.

During the past month she has been getting generally worse, and had abandoned her usual occupation of attending to her household duties.

On Friday morning Mrs. Tackabery rose earlier than usual, helped her sisters to get breakfast, and seemed as usual to be in her usual state of mind.

Shortly after breakfast she went into the dining room and under the pretence of arranging her hair, she had got possession of her father's razor, which she kept on a small shelf near the washstand.

She then went up to her room, and committed the fatal deed. About five minutes after she was found by her father, who found her lying on the floor, with a terrible gash in her throat, from which a terrible stream of blood was issuing.

Neighbors were at once despatched for the neighbors, and the coroner was also summoned, who, on learning the particulars of the case, did not consider it necessary to hold an inquest.

The funeral services, which took place in the Methodist Church here on Monday, were largely attended, and every hand lent the most hearty sympathy to the bereaved relatives who have been in so melancholy and tragic a manner bereft of one of their loved ones.
