WRECK NARROWLY AVERTED. Locomotive Upset But Passengers
Escape With Few Injuries.
Halifax, N. S., Sept. 7.—What came
near resulting in one of the worst
railway accidents ever happening on
the Reid Newfoundland R. Iway becurred Tuesday afternoon at 5.45.
Only one man, the fireman on the locomotive, was injured. He will likely
die.

die.

The accident occurred while a train composed of baggage, two second-class and three first-class coaches was whirling along at high speed around a sharp curve at a place called Cookebrook, 15 miles from Bay of Island. On the right-hand side a steep 15-foot embankment runs the length of the curve, while on the other side a slight declivity extends part way.

When the engine reached the end of the turn, the rails parted, throwing the locomotive on the side of the track, overturning the tender, and causing the crowded second-class cars to leave the rails, as well as the forward part of the diner, leaving the first-class coaches safe.

Had not the last second-class car

Had not the last second-class car jumped the rails to the left the first-class cars would have been precipitated over the highest part of the steep embankment below which would no doubt have brought death to their occurants.

The engine and mostly all the second-class cars and baggage coach are destroyed, and not a few of the passengers had some slight injury.

#### ATTACK ON THE HINDUS.

Dominion Government Without Information—The Only Restrictions.
Ottawa, Sept. 7—The Dominion Government has had no information concerning the report that 750 Hindus are on their way from Bellingham, in Washington Territory, for British Columbia, nor as to the raid upon Hindus in Bellingham. The only thing that Canada can do to prevent Hindus arriving in Canada is to apply to them the terms of the immigration act in the same way as to other British subjects. That is to say, if there are any undesirables among the Hindus they will be deported. Any of them suffering from disease or likely to become a public charge on the community will not be allowed to land in Canada. Beyond this, which is applicable to British subjects as well as foreigners, there are no restrictions upon Hindu immigration. The immigration department has no information on the matter.
