THE VERY THIN WOMAN.

Rules Which She Must Follow In Order to Gain Flesh.

The very thin woman must follow an entirely different regime from that ordinarily pursued if she expects to put flesh on her bones. If she is inclined to worry she should try not to be so intense in unimportant matters—she should shut her eyes, in a sense, to everything she can. The troubles which never happen wear out the nerves and destroy the health more completely than important events. Read only pleasant books and talk as much as possible to cheerful, jolly people who are too light hearted to relate harrowing tales to enlist your sympathy. Hurry is a twin brother to worry, so try to take life as leisurely as you may. Diet is of paramount importance in growing flesh, and, while overfeeding must not be confused with a liberal diet, the thin woman must eat plenty of only such foods as will yield substantial results. Sweet milk and cream, eggs, starch and sweet vegetables and fruits, beef, mutton and fish will certainly increase her weight, unless she has some chronic trouble. Sleep is an important factor in gaining flesh. Get ten hours of regular sleep each night in a room well ventilated and a half hour nap during the day if you can. If inclined to be restless during the night eat a light lunch before retiring. A glass or two of warm milk and a slice of thickly buttered brown bread will be sufficient. Coffee and sweets should never form a part of such a repast.

GIRLS WHO FLIRT.

The Troubles They Are Sure to Bring Upon Themselves.

Girls should bear in mind the fact that if they wish to win the respect of men they must behave in a modest, dignified manner. Why should they respect her if she has no self respect? They will seek her society, and she will appear to have lots of attention, but behind her back they will laugh at her. Men can tell at once the girl whom they can treat in an offhand way; they are not very particular when with her as to their language or conversation, says the Philadelphia Bulletin. They are equally quick to recognize the girl whom they know will allow no freedom; they treat her with a chivalrous respect such as they never show the other girls.

When it comes to choosing a wife men do not often look for her among the girls whom they have flirted with. They want a girl whose bloom has not been rubbed off by constant flirtations with other men, they want a girl who is fresh and sweet, and they do not want to feel that she has been just as sweet to numerous other men as she is to them.

You needn't be cold and stand off in your manner to men. Be as cordial and sweet as you can—indifference never makes friends—but don't, I pray you, spoil your girlish charm by letting any man feel that he can treat you with the slightest familiarity.

CULINARY CONCEITS.

The oftener soup is strained the clearer it becomes. An old napkin serves very well for a strainer.

When stewing prunes, add one or two spoonfuls of red currant jelly to the water in which the prunes are stewed. A tablespoonful of sugar added to the water for boiling roast beef will give a rich brown color as well as fine flavor. An innovation for the table is boiled lettuce. Boil the lettuce until tender, serve the whole head and dress with butter, pepper and salt.

To prevent tomato soup from curdling add the tomato before the milk is put in, and remember to strain the tomato juice before turning it over the flower and butter. Some very admirable cooks greatly simplify cake making by putting all the ingredients, even the eggs, together and making one long and vigorous beating do for the whole.

Egg Tonic.

A raw egg is an excellent tonic and is very strengthening. If prepared in the following way it is really a delicious drink: Put the yolk of an egg into a dish with a teaspoonful of white sugar and a teaspoonful of orange or lemon juice and beat lightly together with a fork. Put the white on a plate and add a pinch of salt. Then with a broad bladed knife beat it to a stiff froth. Now, as lightly as possible, mix all together in the dish, then as lightly transfer it to a clean tumbler, which it will nearly fill if properly made. It must not stand in a warm place, as it soon becomes liquid and loses its snowy look. Any fruit juice may be used in place of orange or lemon.

To Extract a Splinter.

A bit of home surgery, stated to have been practiced when a splinter is driven into a child's hand particularly deep, is its extraction by steam. A bottle with a sufficiently wide mouth is filled two-thirds with very hot water, and the mouth of the bottle is placed under the injured spot. The suction draws the flesh down when a little pressure is used, and the steam in a moment or two extracts inflammation and splinter together. This is very efficacious when the offending substance has been in for several hours, long enough to have started some of its evil consequences.

Creamed Dishes.

It may take a very few more minutes in the preparation, but the effect is sufficiently attractive to be worth the effort if escalloped codfish is cooked in individual baking dishes having buttered bread crumbs on top. In fact, all creamed dishes are attractive if served in ramkins.
