D'ANNUNZIO MAKES A STARTLING DIVERSION

Paris, June 1st.—The troops of Gabriele d'Annunzio, which were reported in advance received here as having occupied the village of Cavajala and threatened to seize Suak, in the Fiume region, are continuing to advance from Fiume, according to information received by the Foreign Office from Belgrade this morning.

The dispatch says the Jugo-Slavs are preparing military measures to resist d'Annunzio. The belief is expressed in high quarters in Paris that d'Annunzio, by creating an incident, seeks to prevent a settlement of the Fiume question, regardless of the consequences to Italy.

WATER NOTICE

Diversion and Use. FUTURE BRITISH NAVAL POLICY

Questions Asked in the House of Commons Elicited no Information of a Definite Nature.

London, June 1.—(Can. Press)—In the course of a discussion in the House of Commons today on the naval estimates, an attempt was made to elicit the details of the future naval policy.

Carlton Belfairs, Unionist, wanted to know whether the fleet would be concentrated in Home waters, or whether Great Britain would have a great Pacific fleet. He thought that there was no menace in the North Sea now, and that therefore, England should have an outlook on the Pacific.

Walter Hume Long, First Lord of the Admiralty, deprecated any discussion in Parliament. He said there was a whole series of questions regarding the future naval policy now before the committee on Imperial defence, and whatever statements of policy were possible, would be made at the proper time.

WILL ATTEMPT SOLITARY FLIGHT TO AUSTRALIA

London, June 1.—A sporting effort to fly to Australia alone in a small aeroplane, has been begun by Lieut. Hinkley, formerly of the British Air Force.

His machine has only a thirty-five horse-power engine with a special petrol tanks to provide enough fuel for from 600 to 750 miles. Lieut. Hinkley will make the flight by way of Paris, Rome and Egypt.

FISHERMAN IS DROWNED

Prince Rupert, June 1.—Angus Robertson, a fisherman, was drowned today off the Balmoral Cannery. The body has not been recovered.



WOMEN WANT TO BE TAXED

Paris, June 1st.—The Woman's suffragette Union of France has congratulated Finance Minister Francis-Marsal upon his rejection of the proposals made by certain senators that women should be exempted from the surtax on bachelors, on the theory that women who remain unmarried do not, as a general rule, do so of their own choice. The suffragette organization holds that women should be equal before the law in all respects.

SALE OF SUGAR WILL BE PROBED

Ottawa, June 1st.—(Can. Press).—The sale of sugar in an Ottawa grocery at 36 cents a pound will be investigated by the board of commerce through all its stages back to the shipment from the refinery. Gosselin and Durocher, the merchants who sold the sugar last Tuesday to a returned soldier named J. Gale, testified before the board this morning that they were informed that day by a wholesaler's traveller that sugar prices had advanced. They raised their price on stocks on hand from 22 cents to 30 cents, and the sale at 36 cents which is complained of, was afterwards adjusted through a refund, to bring the price to 30 cents, the 36-cent price having been charged by mistake.

FISHERMEN MAY STRIKE

Prince Rupert, June 1.—The Skeena salmon fishermen are speaking of striking for 10c. The present rate paid by the canners is 7c.

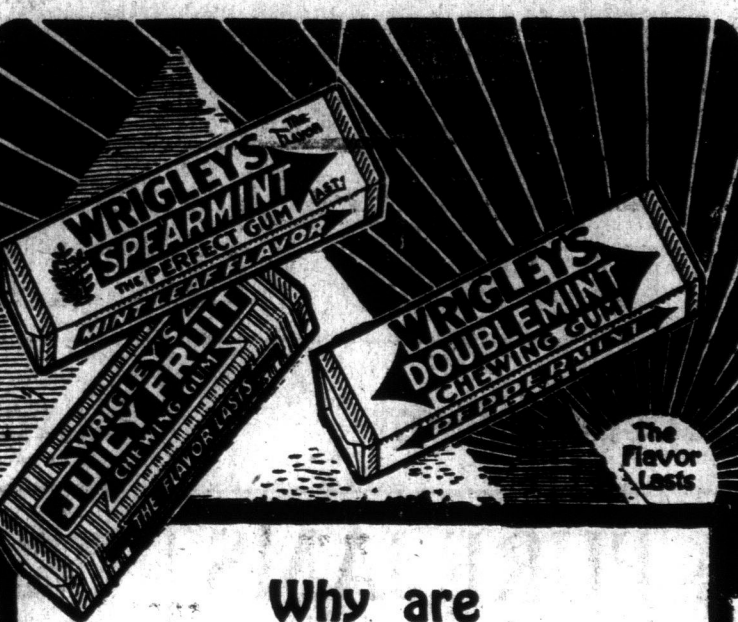
