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Our Provincial Finances

issue of last week, the Provin cial Auditor's report on the Public Accounts of the Province, for the year ended September 30, 1911, shows the total receipts for the twelve months to have been \$384. 797.82, and the total expenditure \$416,631.08. This would leave a deficit on the year's financial transactions of \$31, 833.26. But this does not show the difference between revenue and expenditure, for in the total receipts calculated as above, is included an amoun of \$10,000, proceeds of de bentures sold during the year As these \$10,000 of deben tures are a charge against the Province and constitute that much of the Public debt, they must be added to the debi side of the account. We shall then have, on the face of the public accounts, an expenditure of \$416,631.08 as agains receipts amounting to \$374, 797.82, and an addition to the Provincial debt of \$41 833.26. That is the amount added to the Provincial debi by our Liberal friends in the last year of their political existence in this Province, after holding office for over twenty years and a half. The report places the Provincial debt at \$904.344.51 but adds a note to the effect that unpaid accounts, accrued interest and unfinished contracts are not included.
