GATEWAY TO THE NORTH.
Much has been done recently to attract the eyes of the northward-bound traveler to the gateway to the north, the natural gateway to the rich North West, the gateway to the St. Lawrence of the Empire, published in London, the following article appeared in an Edmonton correspondent:

Mr. J. J. Cornwall, president of the Northern Transportation Company who is now on a business visit to Edmonton, expresses the opinion that Edmonton is not only the gateway to the great northern country, but the logical route to the Findlay river goldfields. There, it appears, more mining activity is being done than anywhere else since the famous year of the Klondike rush.

Prospectors are going in in hundreds, and are going down the Mackenzie, Nahanni, and Liard rivers, quite a number are going into the Findlay river region, where rich gold strikes have been made and into which prospectors and miners are being attracted now by the thousands.

There must be at least two thousand of them. It was given more attention by prospectors going in it could be to the great advantage and would be to the benefit of the country in getting their share of the immense mineral riches that country possesses. The route has a big advantage over the route from the west, in that it is a shorter route.

When it is considered that the route from Victoria to Graham by way of Hazelton is \$25 (25 to 30), a hundred, even a child can see to the advantage is to the city, and to the country, north of here. The trade should be worth millions to Edmonton.

DIFFERENCE IN SCALES.

THE CHINESE OATH.
There was another hearing this morning of the Chinese assault charge preferred by Matt Wah against three Chinese on Rice street. Considerable delay took place in the administration of the oath to the defendants who gave evidence on their own behalf. They were not charged with the assault, but with the Chinese.

THE BANK CLEARINGS SHOWED A DECREASE.
In Edmonton for Year Ending the 31st of July, 1908, the total clearings were \$7,318,371.37, a decrease of \$1,000,000 from the year ending the 31st of July, 1907.

With the close of the first week in July, the clearing houses have passed the second million mark in the clearing of the Bank of Montreal. The clearing house operations have been in charge of the Bank of Montreal since the start of the system in Edmonton two years ago.

What the Clearing House is.
The clearing house is an institution for balancing the mutual indebtedness of the banks in a city with the least possible transfer of actual cash. It is a "clearing" house, and is called against each other on the banks of the clearing house.
