

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"Any person who shall use beam, scale, weight, or measure, in the sale or exchange of any commo dity, not assayed and stamped, or who shall alter the same after being so asseyed and stamped, or who shall use steel-yards, except for the purpose of weighing hay or straw, or

who shall use a beam made of wood, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding twenty dollars." "Salt may be sold by measure, or

by weight; if sold by measure, there shall be eighteen gallons to a tub (liquid measurement), and three ubs to a hogshead. Any person who shall sell or dispose of salt by measure otherwise than according to the standard hereby established, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding twenty dollars."

"The Chief Inspector, and Inspectors shall, when required, inspect and adjust all beams, scales, weights and measures, brought to the office of either of them, according to the said standard, and they shall stamp or mark thereon the initials of the reigning Sovereign, and their own






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
