Two More Victims Of Empress Disaster

Both Were Women and One of Them Identified.

Rimouski, Que., June 29.—The result of the search by the steamer Strathcona for victims of the Empress of Ireland wreck yesterday was the recovery of two bodies. One of these is Maud E. Smith, identified by a money order found in a pocket in her underclothing. Nothing is known about her here. The other body is that of an older woman apparently about forty with light hair. She was partly clad and wore a raincoat, but there was nothing to show whence she came, nor her name. Both bodies were found between the funnels that of Miss Smith by Diver Whitehead of the cruiser Essex. Her head and shoulders were stuck in one of the ventilators and her foot between what appeared to be two ropes. The other body was not far away with one foot caught in the bight of a rope.

NEWS BY CABLE.

Special to Evening Telegram. LONDON, July 3.

The Rt. Hon. Joseph Chamberlain died last night. His death, which came as an entire surprise, removes one of the most striking figures from British politics of a past generation. His health was not publicly known to be any worse than at any time for the past two or three years. Mrs. Chamberlain, who never left her husband's side since he was stricken with paralysis seven years ago, and his son, Rt. Hon. Austin Chamberlain, were with him when death occurred at his London residence. The event cast a gloom to-day over the London season, which was at its height. Mr. Chamberlain's last public appearance was at a garden party in the grounds of his Birmingham home on May 6th last, when with his wife and son, he received several hundred of his constituents. The aged statesman was wheeled around out on the lawn, and appeared very emaciated and feeble when he lifted his hat to his friends and neighbors in acknowledgment of their salutes.

HENLEY-ON-THAMES, July 3.

All doubts as to the destination of the grand challenge cup this year were dispelled to-day, when the Union Boat Club of Boston defeated the Mayence Rowing Club, and Harvard secured the second eight-heat against Winnipeg in the semi finals. The prediction of Robert F. Herrick, the American coach, has thus come true, and two American crews will row up the course here to-morrow in the final, for the edification of English oarsmen. Both American combinations did the distance of 1 mile 550 yards in fast time, 7 minutes flat, which had been beaten only on three previous occasions. Their performance, therefore, gave promise of a great race to-morrow. Although Englishmen prefer the Harvard style and conditions to that of Boston, after to-day's race, Obetes, coxswain of the Boston crew, said: "We got all the best we ever attained in the first fifty strokes. We could not get away from them." Harvard and Boston row off to-morrow afternoon. Lady Hambleton will present the prizes.

LONDON, July 3.

While on their way to Henley Regatta early to-day, Sir Denys Anson was accidentally pushed off a crowded pleasure launch into the Thames, and drowned, together with J. C. Mitchell, who plunged into the water in an effort to save his friend's life. Constantine Beckendorf, the Russian Ambassador, tried to rescue the other two men, and narrowly escaped death himself. He was picked up in a state of collapse.

MONTREAL, July 3.

That thousands of unemployed in Montreal are in imminent danger of being deported to Europe, as the solution of the out-of-work problem, is frankly admitted by the immigration authorities here to-day. All foreigners of less than three years' residence in Canada, who are out of work, who are charges, or have been charges upon the community in Montreal and other large cities will be thus removed.

BELFAST, July 3.

The "Carson squad" of militant suffragettes to-day set fire to and burned to the ground Ballymenoch, near Holyrood, a great residential mansion containing many priceless art treasures, all of which were destroyed. The mansion was the residence of the late Sir Daniel Dixon, ex-M.P., who was Lord Mayor of Belfast.

Household Notes

Always use ointments in tubes instead of jars where possible. Dipping the finger into the jar may mean infection to the next user.

To preserve the flavor of the olives when a large bottle has been opened, pour a little olive oil on the top and keep well corked.

A remedy for grass stains is cream of tartar dissolved in boiling water. Apply when the spot is fresh, and then wash as usual.

Boston asparagus ferns are said to thrive on a dose of coffee. Twice a week use the left-over coffee, with plenty of warm water added.

Barley water for children should be made with 1 teaspoonful of prepared barley flour and 1½ cups of water. Boil twenty minutes.

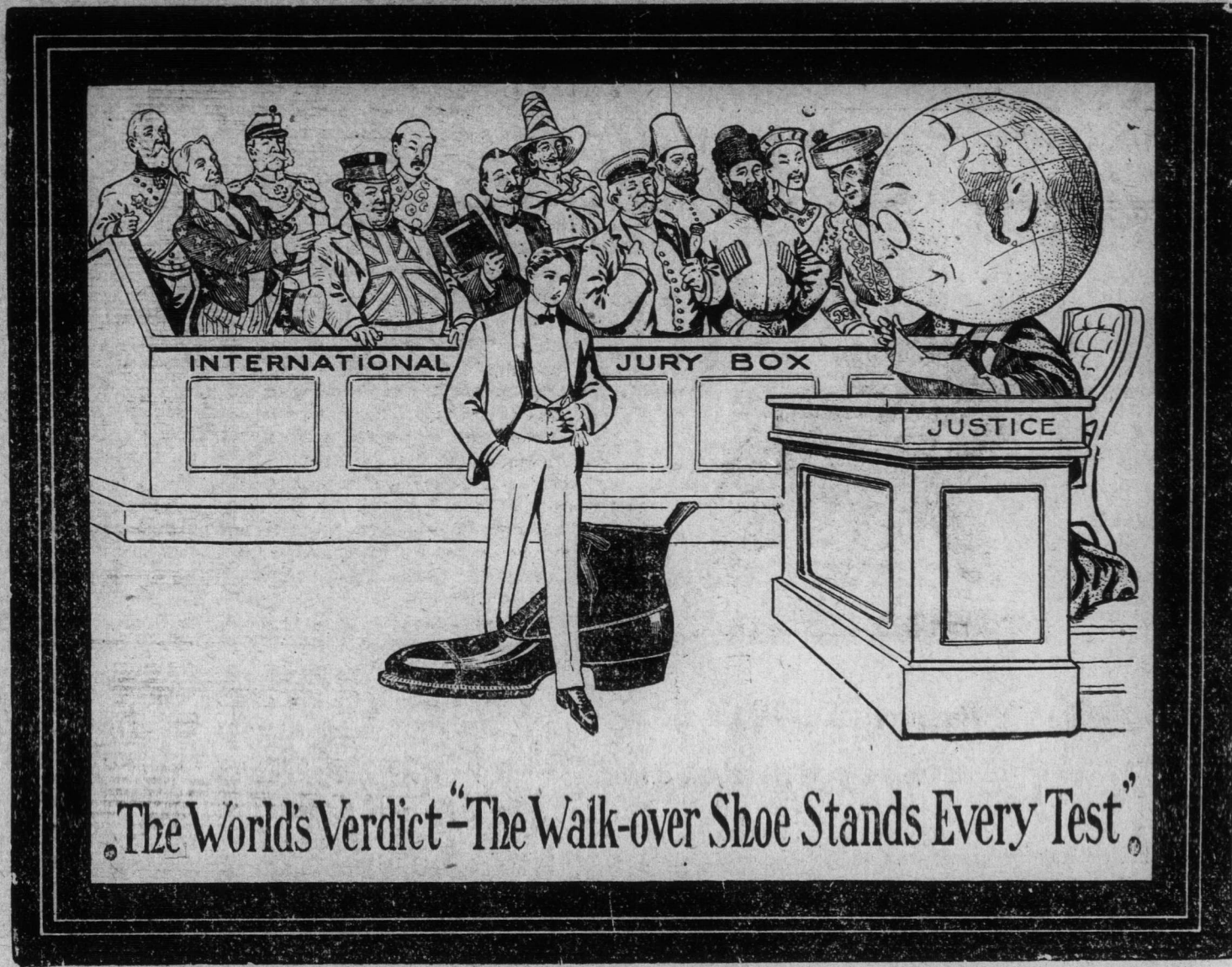
To have hot foods perfectly served, the dishes should be hot and a powder dish cover set over the food as soon as it is placed on them.
