

SAYS CROWN IS ABLE TO RE-QUISITION ANY NEUTRAL SHIP.

London, April 1.-In presenting his rgument before the Prize Court yesterday in favor of requisitioning the cargo of foodstuffs of the American steamer Wilhelmina, the Crown solicitor introduced a hitherto unpublished order-in-council providing that the Crown may requisition any neutral ship.

This order came as a complete surprise to the counsel for the owners of the Wilhelmina's cargo. It revises Rule 29 of the Prize Court, which now reads:

"Where it is made to appear to the udge, on the application of the proper officer of the court, that it is desired to requisition, on behalf of His Majesty, a ship in respect of which no final decree of condemnation has been made, he shall order that the ship shall be appraised and that, upon an undertaking being given in accordance with Rule 5 of this order, this ship shall be released and delivered to the Crown.'

Upon the motion of counsel for the owners of the cargo the Court adjourned to April 13, when counsel will renew his former motion to have a date for the trial set, in an effort o get a decision as to whether the oodstuffs destined for the German ivilians were absolute contraband when the Wilhelmina sailed from the United States.
