It may be granted that the school houses which are the freehold property of the Board are all they should be—and this is allowing more than facts warrant. It may be conceded, too, that the old Baptist chapel, which has been rented and fitted up as a school room, has all requisite internal suitableness. Yet no one will dispute that the large building which has been for a number of years rented from Mr. Day, is utterly insuitable for a school house. Not one of the six rooms occupied is properly ventilated. Some of them are so low in the ceiling that a man of little more than ordinary stature, standing on the floor, could reach it with his upstretched hand. Into rooms scarcely large enough for a moderately sized parlor or bed-room between sixty and seventy children, sometimes even more, are crowded day after day.
