DAMAGES CLAIMED BY BOTH WIVES

Wanstead Victim Twice Married and Each Wife Wants Compensation.

Among those killed in the Grand Trunk accident at Wanstead on Dec. 28, 1902, was Wilson Morton of Toronto and Chicago. Annie F. Morton, of Toronto, and Maud Morton, of Hamilton, each of whom declared she was his widow, claimed damages for his death.

The Grand Trunk then asked the master-in-chambers at Osgoode Hall, Toronto, to consolidate the cases, or else to decide which woman had the prior right as Morton's widow. In his judgment yesterday the master declined to consolidate, holding there was no rule for such a course, and told the Grand Trunk that it must decide for itself, which litigant should apply for indemnity.

The claimants must sue separately, the master says, and then he adds: "So far as I can see, the Grand Trunk must determine upon the lawful widow. Then, if any settlement is made, it can be pleaded in the other action, and that plaintiff must establish her claim as best she can."

I might say that Annie F. Morton was admitted Morton's first wife. The claim of the second wife is based on a divorce granted in Cook county, Illinois, but the first wife disputes the validity of the separation on the ground that no notice had been given her. From this it would seem that Maud Morton would have to establish the validity of the divorce before she could prove claim.

By way of suggesting a preventive of further complications of the kind, the master concludes: "It would seem desirable that suitable legislation should be had from the proper jurisdiction to meet such cases, which are more likely to arise in the future as ideas of matrimonial relationship become more relaxed and tend to curious and perplexing complications."

PETERBORO FOR COMPETITION
Council Awards a 'Phone Franchise to the Canadian Machine Company.

Peterboro has taken the initiative in telephone competition in Canada. At a meeting Monday night the council granted to the Canadian Machine Telephone Company a franchise of the streets of the city for ten years, to erect their poles and string wires necessary for the operation of their system of machines operated by telephone.

The company is to have their system in operation in twelve months, and the wires on the principal business streets are to be placed underground. The price for business phones is not to exceed \$20 per year, and for residences \$15. A business man may have one phone in his place of business and one at his residence for \$30 per year. The company agrees to equip and maintain the system in a modern manner.

This is the first municipality in Canada in which the company has applied for a franchise. The agreement will be ratified by the council this week, and the company will immediately commence work in the installation of the system, which does away with the necessity for operators.

The entrance of this latter concern into the arena makes four telephone companies who are looking to do business in Canada—the Bell Telephone Company, the Canadian Telephone and Telegraph Company, the Canadian Machine Telephone Company and the Stark Electrical Company of Toronto.

OLD RESIDENT OF COUNTY DEAD

First Break in Family of Nine Whose Ages Aggregate 645 Years.

Mr. Henry Routledge, whose death occurred on Monday evening at the residence of his daughter, Mrs. George Beattie, 515 Grosvenor street, was one of the oldest residents of Middlesex county. He was 76 years of age, a son of the late Thomas Routledge, and was born in Huddersfield, Lancashire, of a family of nine children. He lived on con. 7, London township, until a few years ago, when he retired, and took up his residence in the city with his daughter, Mr. Routledge was well known in every part of the township, and enjoyed the confidence and respect of the community. He was a member of the Church of England, and the services at the funeral, to be held on Thursday, at St. John's Cemetery, London township, will be conducted by Rev. G. B. Sage, of West London, and Rev. W. T. Hill, of the Church of St. John the Evangelist, of East London.

Mr. Routledge, whose wife died nearly 25 years ago, is survived by one daughter—Mrs. Beattie—and eight sons and sisters. Mrs. Nelson Norton Brick street; Robert Thomas, Allan, George, William and Jane, of Hyde Park road; John, of East London; and the death is the first break in a family of nine children, whose ages aggregate 645 years, or an average of 72 years. The oldest of the family is 82 years and the youngest 60 years.

The inspectors reported that many of the factories have profited from the suggestions given last year, modern machinery is being put in, better drainage is being provided, and a great many shade trees have been planted. The greatest difficulty experienced has been to secure labor.
