

LONDON RINKS IN TOURNAMENT

Dominion and Ontario Bowling Competitions in Full Swing at Toronto.

Semi-Finals To Be Played Tuesday Night With 25 Rinks in Running.

Toronto, Aug. 22.—Play in the Dominion and Ontario bowling competitions was continued at the annual Dominion bowling tournament this morning, and in addition the Toronto event was commenced. Play was held up to a certain degree by the various rinks changing from one club to another, and as much progress was not reported as anticipated.

Twenty-five of the 193 rinks that started in the Dominion event were still in the running at noon with 24 of them being engaged in the second draw of the day. The semi-finals will be reached tonight. Of the 25 rinks that remain 5 are from points outside of Toronto, Hamilton having two and Belleville, Weston and Kingston one each. Of the local clubs Canada are the largest represented, with four rinks, St. Matthews and Rusholme three each, while Kew Beach and High Park have a pair each. Those with a single representative left in the primary event are Thistles, Riverdale, Withrow, Lawrence Park, Oakwoods, and R. C. Y.

Tom Chambers, the veteran skip from the Hamilton Victorias, went down before A. McCurdy of Rusholme in the second round by a margin of 100. The match was a close one, the victor being the final was eliminated. Sir John Wilson disposed of Chapman of Guilph, and then was drawn against a club mate, McKay of Canadas. Last year's trophy winners, McDougall's Riverdale four, still pursue their undefeated way, as do Goforth's Canada quartet, who were defeated in last year's final.

Brings Crew of Missing New York Sight-Seeing Plane Safely to Land

New York, Aug. 22.—One of the most elaborate searches ever devised to locate a missing airplane was called off early today when a fishing smack arrived at Long Beach, 40 miles from here, bringing W. T. Miller, pilot, Harold Thompson, mechanic, and the lone passenger of the seaplane Ambassador II, that dropped from sight Sunday morning.

The fishing smack attempted to tow the battered hulk of the sky cruiser, in which the three men had fought a game fight for 48 hours against the chill winds and waves, but finally had to abandon it to the waters of the Atlantic.

Drawn and haggard from exposure, with nothing to eat and only a little sleep, the three men refused to tell of their adventures until they had recovered from the exhaustion caused by their experience. The identity of the passenger was not learned, it being said that he did not desire to cause his family any anxiety, as he was supposed to have gone on a business trip.

Both Miller and Thompson, who are in their 20's, saw air service during the war, and fellow aviators, say Miller has high rating as an aviator and a record singularly free from mishaps.

The search for the sight-seeing plane started Sunday after Miller failed to return from what was to have been a flight over the Fire Island lighthouse.

ST. THOMAS COAL CRISIS RELIEVED

Dealers Give Assurances of Readiness To Co-operate in Every Way Possible.

ST. THOMAS, Aug. 21.—Coal prices in the city have fallen considerably with the settlement of the soft coal strike in the United States, and the situation is considerably relieved here. Mayor Charles Raven reports.

With prices moving downward, it is not considered good policy for the city to invest in large supplies of soft coal, as was formerly advised. This is particularly the case on account of the assurances by local dealers that they will co-operate in every way possible in helping to relieve any shortage which may occur.

The mayor, however, emphasizes the desirability of citizens investing in supplies of soft coal, coke or wood as fuel for the early part of the winter as the prospects for anthracite coal being shipped until the middle of December or next January are far from bright, and he deems it advisable for householders to wait. Small amounts of hard coal may get through to Canada the local dealers report, but the mine operators are promising no deliveries.

Mayor Raven has learned that there is quite a plentiful supply of Pocahontas coal available and also Welsh coal, which compares with the American soft coal from the United States can now be purchased for \$14 or \$15 a ton.

It is probable that the city will invest in a quantity of wood.

MANY ATTEND FUNERAL OF MRS. MARY CAMERON

Pioneer Settler of Stanley Township Dies in 75th Year.

SEAFORTH, Aug. 21.—There was a large attendance at the funeral of Mary Baird, fourth daughter of the late Thomas Baird of Stanley and widow of the late John Cameron, who passed away on Wednesday evening, August 16, after an illness of six weeks.

The funeral was held from the residence of her brother-in-law, Mr. Alexander Thompson, on Saturday afternoon to Baird's Cemetery. Rev. W. D. McIntosh officiating.

The late Mrs. Cameron was born in Auchinleck, Ayrshire, Scotland, on Oct. 30, 1847, and came to this country with her parents in 1852. She was united in marriage to the late John Cameron on November 24, 1878, and came to reside on the 4th concession of Stanley. Their only child died in infancy.

After her husband's death in 1901 she went to live with her sister, Mrs. Alexander Thompson, where she remained until her death.

Mrs. Cameron was an esteemed member of the Brucefield Presbyterian Church, and was greatly beloved in the community, where she spent 69 years.

Mrs. Peter Campbell is another sister, and Thomas Baird of Stanley is a brother.

INDIAN GETS JAIL TERM FOR BREAKING INTO HOUSE

ST. THOMAS, Aug. 21.—Stolen money was used "profitably," Henry Hill, an Indian of 18 years of age, told County Magistrate Hunt, Monday morning, when he faced a charge of breaking and entering the dwelling of D. Jamieson of Southwood.

Eleven dollars were taken, \$4 of which was used in paying bills and \$3.15 went to pay insurance for his father and mother. The remainder was used to buy groceries.

Hill was sentenced to six months in the Burwash Reformatory.

His Worship Magistrate Hunt, in pronouncing sentence, stated that the second charge of stealing, was not being pressed, but that the first was a serious offence for which the accused might be sent down for seven years.

WINS POINT IN WILSON TRIAL

Defense For Former London Evangelist Scores in Los Angeles Court.

Reputed Dying Statement of Cox Ruled Out by Judge Wood.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Aug. 21.—The defense in the trial of Herbert Wilson, formerly of London, Ont., charged with the murder of Herbert Cox during a sensational attempted jail break some time ago, scored today when Superior Judge J. Perry Wood refused to admit the reputed dying statement of Cox. The court held after hearing a discussion of the case that the statements testified to by Deputy Sheriff Frank Dewar were not proven to be the last words of Cox.

Wilson was also testified to during the proceedings that Roy Rankin, a turnkey in the jail, accepted \$1,000 in cash to let the prisoners on the Bridge of Sighs, where the murder took place.

Rankin testified that he was approached by Cox and all the arrangements made to have the bridge grating open on the afternoon of the break. He then told Deputy Sheriff Manning of the plan of the prisoners. Later, Rankin stated in reply to the questions of Paul W. Schenck, Wilson's counsel, he met Wilson began a discussion of the matter.

After learning that the door would be unlocked, Wilson gave Rankin ten \$100 bills. Rankin stated that he saw Cox and a man by the name of O'Brien enter the bridge, but did not see Wilson. The trial will be continued tomorrow.

REPORT ONTARIO CROPS INDICATE HEAVY YIELDS

TORONTO, Aug. 21.—Ontario's hot weather crops are mostly making fair progress, according to the reports of the Ontario Agricultural Department's county representatives this week. In Kent and adjoining counties the tobacco has been maturing rapidly and the harvesting will probably commence next week. Canadian peaches are now appearing on the market and the reports say there will be a fair supply.

Some grades of apples are plentiful, others have been lost to heavy recent windstorms and the peach disease. In some districts it is reported that the recent hot dry weather has brought corn along too fast, but on the whole the yield will be good.

In nearly all sections of lower Ontario the grain crops have been cut and stacked. A large proportion is threshed or in the barns.
