Everyfamily or adult has an account at the "store," certain credits being apportioned to all members by the elders at the commencement of each year, which are drawn against by purchasers. each village in groups of from forty to fifty each. Houses are assigned to families by the siders, who provide shelter for all. The com-nunity conducts a number of mills and man-facturing enterprises.






