HIS TELEPHONE TO THE SUN.

When the conversation turned to the telephone I asked Mr. Edison as to his telephone to the sun. This telephone experiment is the biggest thing of the kind in nature. There is in the New Jersey mountains a vast mass of iron a mile long and of about the same width, which runs straight down into the earth for a number of miles. "The telephone," said Mr. Edisen, "is, you knew, made by running a wire around the top of a magnetic bar and this machine when charged with electricity enables us to register the sounds which come in contact with it. We are using this immense natural bar of iron of the New Jersey mountains as the basis of our telephone. We have wound miles of wire about its top and have formed an inductive circuit in which we will have the most powerful of electric currents.
