





IT MAY SUPPLANT STEAM

A 110-Ton Electric Locomotive Which

Generates Its Own Power. The accompanying illustration, which will serve to convey a fair idea of the 100-ton electric locomotive designed by Mr. Heilmann, of Paris, in which the



The first trial of this locomotive came off August 21, at Havre on a track about two and a half miles long with quite stiff grades and curves of 260 feet radiu/s. The test proved satisfactory in every way. 
