Ball bearings are successful only when the balls themselves are of the highest quality, and the shells and are firmed at the highest perfection, writes Professor Sweet in the Rural New Yorker. The limit of error in the best does not vary more than one-quarter of one-thousandth of an inch, or one-fourth the thickness of tissue paper.' Such perfection is very costly, and the least dirt destroys the whole gain, for if the balls be stopped by any impediment, they are very soon ruined. Such accurate work is not likely to be properly protected or properly cared for in tarm vehicles. Hence it is questionable whether the failures would not more than overbalance the advantages; besides, in the cost of drawing a load, a part is friction and a part is overcoming the ground resistance. I have just been over a dirt road where one hundred tons of limestone are drawn every day, and the ruts were horrible when only common wagons were used.
