

# TO EXTEND THE LINE TO LAMBTON

The Toronto and Suburban Street Railway Co. intended proceeding with the laying of the rails in Yonge-street to Richmond Hill, in accordance with its agreement.

Mr. Bryson (Richmond) wanted to know who was responsible for calling together of the special committee appointed in the Fotheringham matter. Mr. Bryson explained that he had understood that it was the intention that the committee should meet until the present session of council, and as the meeting that was called entailed an expense of something over \$50 he wanted to know who was responsible for it.

The Warden replied that after a conference with the clerk they came to the conclusion that it would be in the interest of the county for the committee to meet previous to meeting of council, so that they would have time to present a report.

To extend to Lambton. The Toronto and Suburban Street Railway Co. applied for a franchise for the construction and operation of an electric railway from the end of its present system in Dundas-street, westward to Lambton and Fallington, along Dundas-street. It is the intention of the company, if the franchise is granted, to commence the construction at as early a date as practicable over the route asked for.

The special committee appointed to deal with the complaint against Public School Inspector Smith for South York reported that in reference to the circular mailed to the School Trustees Boards 62 had replied, 112 trustees were in favor of Mr. Fotheringham's resignation, and 68 opposed. One board of three trustees thought the inspector rather arbitrary and extreme in his views. The committee also received a copy of resolutions passed by the Public School Boards of Weston, East Toronto, Stouffville and Toronto Junction, expressing confidence in the inspector. The report was adopted.

The District Superintendent. William J. Hill, commissioner for district No. 2, Yonge-street, reported the total expenditure for the district as \$289,760, and the grant \$1800.

Mr. Halburn, commissioner for the section north of Yonge-street, reported expenditure of \$203,28, and the appropriation made was \$1000.

James Chester, commissioner for Kingston Road, reported an expenditure of \$8006.88, the grant being \$2800, leaving a balance on hand of \$104,62.

Mr. Darby, commissioner for section No. 1, Yonge-street, reported total expenditure of \$234,15. Grant \$2200.

William H. Pugh, commissioner for sections 3 and 4, Yonge-street, reported his expenditures as \$216,01, and the grant \$2000.

Mr. Yale moved, seconded by Mr. Stokes, that William L. Linton, Auditor, be the student nominating for the Council to receive instruction at the Ontario Agricultural College.

After a short discussion the original motion was declared carried. Mayor Kennedy and Mr. Caswell waited on the council in reference to the transfer of the city of the agreement with the Mimico Railway and the maintenance of the Lake Shore.

The matter was referred to a special committee which will report on Friday.
