Thanksgiving Day Maneuvres.

Final arrangements have been made for the military maneuvres to-day. The point of attack will be the junction of Ezlinton-avenue and Spadina-road, about three miles northwest of the corner of Bloor and Yonge-streets, where the snemy will be entrenched in a position the attacking force will endeavor to dispossess them of. The attacking force under Lieut.-Col. Otter will consist of the Queen's Own, Grenadiers and Highlanders. The three regiments will assemble in their armories at \$.30 a.m. and march to the junction of Spadina and Davenport-roads, where the advance proper will begin up Spadina-road. The 13th of Hamilton will be conveyed by a special train to a point west of the city. At St. Clair-avenue, a mile and a quarter south of the final point of attack, the enemy will first be discovered. When the fight is over, victors and vanquished will return to the camp ground near Spadina-road and St. Clair-avenue, where lunch will be served.

The march past will take place about 2.30 in St. George-street, between Bernard and Lowther-avenues. The volunteers will return by St. George, College and Yonge-streets to the armories.
