## MY MIND IS ALL GONE NOW

E. W. BLACKHALL COMMITS SUICIDE BY SHOOTING.

I Must Have Softening of the Brain," He Wrote to His Daughter-Went to the Bathroom and Sent a Bullet Through His Brain-No Inquest Deemed

"My mind is all gone, now; I must have softening of the brain; I can't think, write, or do anything." These were the words of Edward Wakefield Blackhall, addressed to his daughter on Tuesday last. At 10 o'clock yesterday morning the unfor-tunate man shot himself through the head in the bathroom of his residence,

Mr. Blackhall was 53 years of age and a dealer in bookbinders' machinery. He was known as on inventor, and carried on business in Lombarustreet, also conducting an establishment in Buffalo. In the early spring he paid a long business visit to Chicago and while there so overworked himself that his health was seriously affected.

Nervous Prostration by Giving Up Smoking. His illness, however, did not assume an acute form until the middle of August, when he suddenly formed the resolution to abandon smoking, to which he had for years been inveterately addicted. Extreme nervous prostration following, for which the deceased was treated by Dr. John Caven of Carlton-tsreet, without apparent benefit

Yesterday morning, Miss Blackhall, noticing: that her father appeared more despondent than usual, persuaded him to remain in the house. He went upstairs at 9.30, saying he was going to lie down, but his daughter found him in the bathroom shortly infterwards and induced him to descend with her. Then Miss Blackhall became alarmed and her mother hurried off to summon Dr. Caven, despite her husband's objections.

His Daughter Heard the Shet.

Deceased returned to the bathroom, and in a few moments Miss Maud Blackhall, a younger daughter, heard the report of a pistol. Entrance was effected to the room, where Mr. Blackhall was found lying on the floor with a wound behind the right ear. Death had been instantaneous, the bullet having penetrated the brain. By the dead man's side was found a 32 calibre revolver, one chamber empty. In the meantime Dr. Caven arrived, but his services could do no good.

A Pending Law Suit. His Daughter Heard the Shot.

No causes other than those given above can be assigned for his act. He was, however, concerned in a pending lawsuit regarding patent rights, but the family believe that this had no influencing effect, as deceased never referred to legal matters and there was no reason why the suit should have such a tragic effect.

Coroner Alkins yesterday issued a warrant for an inquest, but after an informal inquiry and an examination of the deceased's body by Dr. Caven, he decided an inquest to be unnecessary.
