CAN WE IMPORT REPRINTS?

NEW POINTS RAISED IN CONNECTION WITH COPYRIGHT.  
Mr. Julian Pauncefote at Ottawa—Dr. Canada is expected to pass a bill on the subject of copyright in the chamber of the House on 21st Day.

Ottawa, Ont., Oct. 3.—The decision having been rendered that the author's royalty of 12 1/2 per cent. on foreign reprints of British copyright works can no longer be legally collected by the collector of customs, the question of the Mother Country on the copyright question has been under consideration. The Imperial Parliament in 1842, for the express purpose of protecting the British authors, passed an Act prohibiting the importation of any foreign reprints of British copyright works into this country.

Whether the Home Government will insist upon the law being carried out in this regard remains to be seen. These works are prohibited it will be a serious loss to Canadian readers who are in the habit of purchasing them. MY MIND IS ALL GONE NOW.

E. W. BLACKHALL COMITS SUICIDE BY SHOOTING.

"My mind is all gone now; I must have someone to do my thinking for me. I can't think, write, or do anything." These were the words of Edward W. Blackhall, addressed to his daughter on Tuesday morning, the occasion of a visit to his residence. He had just returned from a visit to his daughter's residence, and while there he had committed suicide by shooting himself through the head in the bathroom of his residence, No. 93 Wood-street.

Mr. Blackhall was 53 years of age and a dealer in bookbinders' machinery. He was known as an inventor, and had been in business in London-street, also conducting an establishment in Buffalo. In the early spring he had a long business visit to Chicago and while there he overworked himself so that his health was seriously affected.

Yesterday morning, Miss Blackhall, noticing that her father appeared unwell, called on him, and persuaded him to remain in the house. He went upstairs at 9:30, saying he was going to bed. His daughter found him in the bathroom shortly afterwards and induced him to get dressed. She then called Blackhall, who became alarmed and her mother hurried off to summon Dr. Caven, despite her husband's objections.

His Daughter Heard the Shot. Deceased returned to the bathroom, and as he was about to enter, Miss Blackhall, a younger daughter, heard the report of a pistol. Entrance was effected to the room, and Miss Blackhall was found lying on the floor with a wound behind the right ear. The bullet had been instantaneous, the bullet having penetrated the brain. By the time the doctor arrived, Blackhall had become a corpse. His death was a great loss to the family.

A Pending Law Suit. No causes other than those given above can be assigned for his act. He was, however, concerned in a pending lawsuit regarding patent rights, but the family believe that this was not the inducing cause, as deceased never referred to legal matters and there was no reason to suppose that he had any such pending suit.

Coroner Atkins yesterday issued a subpoena for the coroner's inquest into the death of the deceased by Dr. Caven, but he decided an inquest to be unnecessary. Deceased leaves three daughters and four sons.

Prof. Rogers Took Cruise. Boston, Oct. 3.—The autopsy on the body of the late Prof. Elliot F. Rogers, who died in the city of Boston, was held at the coroner's inquest yesterday. The report of the coroner's inquest was that the deceased had died of a heart attack.

A Fire Broke Him In. Rush City, Minn., Oct. 3.—F. S. Christensen, Danish Vice-Consul for Minnesota, shot himself through the heart yesterday. A few days ago his house was burned down, and he was very ill. He had a very serious effect on the mind of Christensen, and it is believed his suicide was caused by temporary derangement.
