tions at the refinery are a full quarter cent higher. For leather there is but light enquiry, and no improvement is looked for until after the turn of the year. Hides have declined half a cent; an amalgamation has been effected between the hide dealers, by the terms of which all their purchases will be stored and sold from one common warehouse, and at uniform prices. Butter and cheese move slowly, and there has been no noteworthy variation in prices. Country collections rule slow as a whole, though some dry goods houses report excellent returns on 4th Dec. payments.

An improvement in general trade at Toronto has taken place during the week. The wintry weather has stimulated the demand for heavy dry goods and furs, and the holiday trade has increased some. A large number of houses are engaged in taking stock, and it is thought that results will be fairly satisfactory for the year. Prices the past six months have been firm at advancing rates, particularly in cottons, woollens, and silks, and one would naturally suppose that profits would be greater in consequence. However, competition has been very keen and a greater number than usual of bankrupt stocks have been on the market. Hardware dealers report a fair trade, and a moderate business is going in groceries. Sugars are firmer, and dried fruits also. The movement of gain shows a slight increase, but prices are heavy and weaker for wheat and oats. Thursday evening, Dec. 12.



McIntyre & Wardwell (John J. Dixon), received the Jollowing dispatch from Schwartz, Dupee & Co., Chicago:
The wheat market started off firmer today and for a while looked like it might rally a little on the demand from local shorts, who were liberal seilers yesterday, but the aggregate demand was insufficient to sustain the improvement. Outside trade was very small, and the market finally closed at the lowest price of the day. New York wired that Argentine crop prospects were more favorable. San Francisco reported three or four loads for Australian account. There is no change in the crop situation in the weekly report of the Cincinnati Price Current. The output of flour in the Northwest last week was 410,000 barrels, but Minneapolis wired that bids being received now are too low to admit of profit. Purchases by elevator at interlor points in the Northwest are reported larger. Receipts in Northwest were 800 cars, against 1070 last week and 570 last year. The cash demand for winter wheat was small, probably on account of high premium demand for it over current prices for spring wheat. The weakest feature in the situation here is the lack of outside interest in the market.

Provisions—Quite active and market for the first time showed resistance to the pressure of liquidation and selling by packers. Commission houses bought freely and some of the packers were buying in the belief
