Orange Marmalade.

Three thin skinned oranges, one cupful of sugar, two tablespoonfuls of lemon juice. Wash the oranges, cut in half and remove the pulp with a teaspoon. Cut the rind in quarters, then remove all fiber; put the rind in two quarts of cold water for twentyfour hours. Drain, cover with fresh water and boil until tender.
