**our Legislatures.**

Canada has escaped class representation in its popular Legislatures. A feature of our Parliaments is the preponderance of lawyers. This is not class representation—that is to say, the lawyers are not elected by lawyers, who are a very small proportion of the population, but by men of the classes. An interesting table recently prepared shows the preponderance of business and professional men in our legislative bodies, and the almost total lack of mechanics and laborers. The business and professional men are less than 17 per cent. of the population, but have more than 81 per cent. of the representation. The mechanics and laborers have nearly 27 per cent. of the population, but only half of one per cent. of the representation. Farmers have 46 1/2 per cent. of the population and a little over 18 per cent. of the representation.

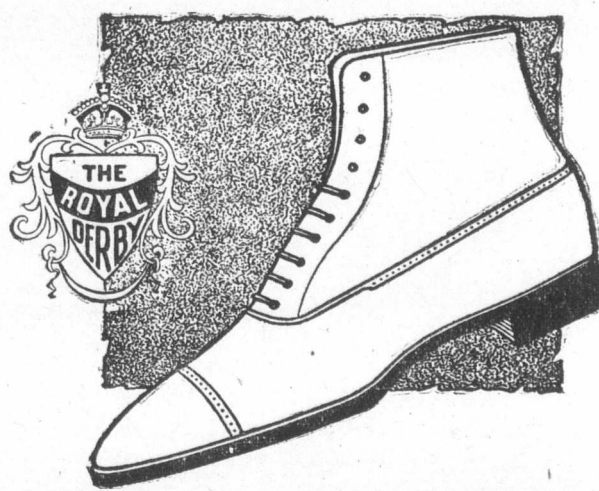
