usual implements. In short the crop requires the same treatment as a crop of common corn and no more or less. The cane is ready for cutting when the seed is in the soft or "dough" state, but cutting may be deferred until the seed is ripe, or until a frost arrests the growth. In the latter case the crop must be cut immediately to prevent fermentation and souring of the sap. The harvesting consists in stripping the stalks of the leaves by downward strokes of a forked implement, of gathering the seed tassels by topping them off and cutting the cane as near the ground as possible. The canes are tied in bundles and shocked as is usual tor corn. They may then be ground or crushed to express the juice as soon as may be; the sooner the better although they have been kept in this condition in the field for a month without injury.
