ALBANY LUMBER MARKET.

SALES have been large during the week, and prices remain firm. There is a good supply of everything excepting hemlock and spruce, of which there is a scarcity; also of common grades of pine, particularly 1½ inch siding. The demand is active for the latter. Freight remains unchanged, and values are scarce. The receipts at the Canal Collector's Office during the week were, via Erie Canal, 6,610,000 feet of lumber, and 101,100 shingles; via Champlain Canal, 6,229,633 feet of Lumber.
