

### Scient's and Useful.

Rice With Tomato.—Wash your rice thoroughly; put it over with plenty of water and boil hard for twenty minutes without stirring; add an eq. al quantity of stewed and strained tomato; season with salt, butter and cayenne pepper. Serve very hot.

ROAST I OIN OF VEAL -- For the stuffing ROAST I OIN OF VEAL.—For the stuffing chop a small onion, a handful of parsley, and fry in butter; add a half-pound of sausage meat; mix with one pint of bread crumbs, salt, pepper and thyme and moisten with two well-beaten eggs. Sew the flap of the meat firmly over the under side to enclose this stuffing. Place in the pan, with salt, pepper, and a pint of broth and baste often.

CINVAMON ROLLS are made by taking the dough just as in the fruit loaf. Spread the roll with butter and sprinkle cinnamon and sugar over it; roll it up tightly; then cut off strips as you would if you were making biscuits; put them into the baking tins, put a little lump of sugar on the top of each one, and sprinkle sugar and cinnamon on each; let them rise until light, and then bake quickly. TOMATO OMELET.-Scald and skin three ripe tomatoes, quarter them; fry a quarter of an onion (mineed) in an ounce of butter, toss the tomatoes in this, add a little water to the tomatoes in this, add a little water to prevent burning; season with salt, a pinch of cayenne and a very slight suspicion of mace; simmer until reduced to a pulp. Break three eggs separately, beat them together, put them in a frying pan, and when slightly browned on the bottom prepare to fold the omelet; just before doing so, add the tomato pulp and turn the omelet out on a hot dish, surround it with a little tomato sauce and serve.
