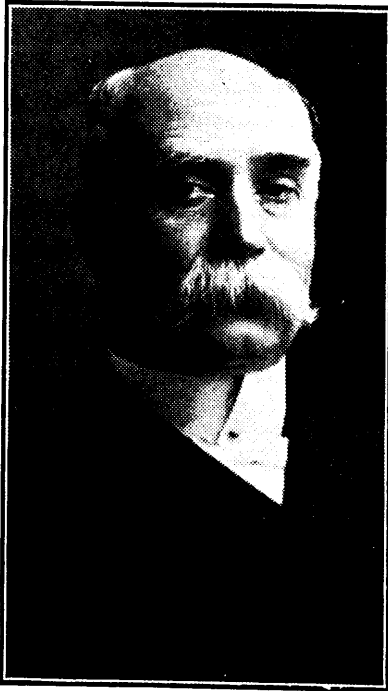


Sunday schools connected with his Hamilton charge and there he had an assistant. The roll numbered nearly 1,300.
