To refresh your memory, the Other Government Departments or **OGD application** is one of DFAIT's

corporate database applications. It provides a fast and easy method of locating an electronic mailing address for any listed Government of Canada employee in the world. Using the application is simple. Once you have located a person in OGD, you can copy their e-mail address, paste it into ICONDESK and then send your message. 

How to Use Paper Wisely: A "Green" Tip from Catherine Nagy (MUNIC)

Is your blue wastebasket, like many we've seen, overflowing with paper that has text only on one side? Shame on you! Here's a great idea that Catherine Nagy (MUNIC) has for reducing excess paper. "Put it to good use," she says, "by setting up a simple "environmental" system like the one I initiated in Munich:

"Dedicate one of each of the printers' bins for "scratch" copies. Gather paper that is used only on one side (and is in good condition) and use the blank side for printing internal-use documents like org. mail, e-mail, drafts of documents, and even faxes. It's simple and effective."
