

The Canadian side informed the Soviet side of the interest of the Universities of Manitoba and Alberta in conducting exchanges with the Universities of Lvov and Kiev respectively.

4. The Soviet side agreed to receive, at the expense of the Canadian side (Dalhousie University) twelve Canadian students per year for a period of approximately four months (February - May) to study the Russian language at the Pushkin Institute. These Canadian students will as a rule be majors in Russian language and literature. Their applications are to be communicated to the Soviet side by the Canadian side no later than October 1st of the year before their participation in the programme, and the Soviet side will in turn inform the Canadian side about placement no later than November 15th. Both sides agreed that two of the student places mentioned in this article will be offered on an exchange basis between the Pushkin Institute and Dalhousie University. The financial and curricular modalities will be worked out between the institutions involved.

5. The Soviet side agreed to receive at the expense of the Canadian side up to 30 Canadians per year as correspondence students at the Pushkin Institute.

6. The Canadian side agreed to use its best endeavours to continue to seek placement of up to two Soviet teachers of the Russian language annually to teach in institutions of higher learning in Canada.

7. The Canadian side will continue to convey to the appropriate educational authorities in Canada the Soviet side's willingness to send at their invitation, teachers of the Russian and Ukrainian languages to work in the higher educational institutions of Canada as well as specialists to
