

between verification in arms control, confidence building and peacekeeping contexts. It should be noted however that such literature has been included only where it discusses in a substantive manner methods and processes of verification and compliance.

A variety of sources have been examined for this Fourth Update, which are listed below.

- The Conference on Disarmament (CD), 1994-1995: Plenary Working Papers up to September 1995 are covered in this Fourth Update.
- United Nations publications: Apart from its operational verification activities in the context of peacekeeping, the United Nations has been active in the field of verification mainly in two ways: as a source of research and as a forum for deliberation. Coverage in this bibliography includes UN General Assembly and Security Council resolutions pertaining to verification and submissions on this subject from the Secretary General as well as the Member States of the UN. Also covered are relevant UN Secretary General studies and research publications by the United Nations Institute for Disarmament Research (UNIDIR), as well as UNSCOM inspection and fact-finding reports.
- Other International Organizations: Several other organizations besides the CD and the UN have dealt with verification issues. Two such organizations are the International Atomic Energy Agency and the Western European Union. Budgetary and other similar annual documents, however, have not been included.
- National Governments: Canadian, and to some extent American governmental publications have been covered in the Fourth Update.
- Academic Publications: The Fourth Update contains books, reports, articles and papers submitted at various conferences, and individual academic papers appearing in a variety of journals. Where the contents of conference proceedings or edited publications are of particular interest, articles have been listed individually under the author's name, not under those of the editors of the proceedings.
- International Treaties and Agreements: The texts of international treaties and agreements have not been covered by the Fourth Update.
