CANADA WEEK PROCLAIMED AT PHILADELPHIA

OTTAWA, October 1, 1964 -- October 5 to 10 has been set aside as Canada Week in Philadelphia. Mayor James H.J. Tate made the proclamation yesterday.

The Hon. Paul Martin, Secretary of State for External Affairs and the Hon. Mitchell Sharp, Minister of Trade and Commerce, today expressed pleasure with the city's decision to honour and recognize the friendship and trade that exists between the people of Canada and the citizens of Philadelphia.

Mr. Martin said, "On the occasion of the proclamation of the second Canada Week in the City of Philadelphia, it gives me great pleasure to express to Mayor Tate and the citizens of Philadelphia my sincere appreciation for the honour which they are thus according to Canada and the Canadian people."

Mr. Sharp said, "I urge all Canadians, and in particular businessmen, to take advantage of Canada Week to renew friendships and business ties inasmuch as Philadelphia has set this week aside especially to welcome Canadians."

In his proclamation, Mayor Tate said in part: "Whereas Philadelphia is one of the major producers of commodities
