The House, according to Order, proceeded to take into consideration the Amendments made by the Senate to Bill, No. 100, intituled: "An Act respecting Game in the Northwest Territories of Canada, and the same were read, as follow:--

1. Page 2, line 10.—After "hunted " insert " trapped ".

2. Page 2, line 13.—Strike out paragraph (a) and substitute the following:-

"(a) Moose, deer and mountain goat between the first day of April and the first day of September;

"(b) Caribou and mountain sheep between the first day of April and the first day of August and between the first day of October and the first day of December;"

3. Page 2, line 46.—After "hunted" insert "trapped".

4. Page 3, line 2.-After "hunted" insert "trapped".

5. Page 3, line 7.—After "hunted" insert "trapped".

6. Page 3, line 10.—After "hunted" insert "trapped".

7. Page 3, line 48.—Insert the following as paragraph (f):—

"(f) governing the number of mammals and birds that may be killed or taken by any person in one season:"

8. Page 4, line 10.—After "hunt" insert "trap".

9. Page 6, line 24.-After "four" insert "or under section eleven".

The said Amendments, being read a second time, were agreed to.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry back the Bill to the Senate, and acquaint their Honours, That this House hath agreed to their Amendments.

The Order of the Day being read for the House to again resolve itself into the Committee of Supply;

Sir Thomas White moved, seconded by Mr. Hazen,

Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Seven thousand one hundred dollars be granted to His Majesty, for Civil Government—Department of Insurance—To provide for three clerkships in Third Division, Sub-division B, 1 at \$800, 1 at \$700, 1 at \$600, \$2,100; Contingencies—Printing, binding and stationery, including cost of annual reports—Further amount required, \$5,000, for the year ending 31st March, 1918.

5. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding One thousand two hundred dollars be granted to His Majesty, for Pension to Lady Cartwright, for the year ending 31st March, 1918.

6. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding One hundred dollars be granted to His Majesty, for Civil Government—Department of Finance and Treasury Board—To
