REMOVAL FROM MARKET OF ANTI-BIOTIC LOZENGES

Question No. 1025-Mr. Howe (Hamilton South):

Has the government taken any action to remove from the market any kinds of antibiotic throat lozenges and, if so, on what date was such action taken, and for what reason?

Hon. A. J. MacEachen (Minister of National Health and Welfare): No. The food and drug directorate of the Department of National Health and Welfare has notified manufacturers of throat lozenges containing less than 3,000 international units of penicillin, that these products will be placed on prescription. Action has been initiated to amend the food in English, of the commission of inquiry into 23033-193

and drug regulations to bring this requirement into effect. This action is being taken to ensure that these products are used under medical direction, since small doses of penicillin may result in the development of sensitivity to this drug in certain individuals as well as the development of resistant organisms.
