#### PRIVATE MORTGAGE MARKET

This survey was done by way of personal

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interview. A report on these personal interviews was made to the minister by the corporation. It is privileged by virtue of the relationship between the corporation and the minister who reports to Parliament for the corporation. It covers matters of a confidential nature and would not be in the interests of the public to have it disclosed. If the government was obliged to disclose the contents of the survey made, the approved lenders would not be prepared in the future to provide the corporation with such confidential information. I therefore ask the hon. member to withdraw his motion.
