Hansard printed. Apparently it is going to be available only tomorrow. I would simply suggest that, if that occurs again in the future, the calendar not move until Hansard is available. For example, today, I wanted to respond to Senator Marshall's comments, but because I did not have his excellent statement of yesterday in print form there was no way I could do that and risk misinterpreting or distorting his words. I simply put that in the pile with everything else.
