

and striving to the last"! It is mentioned that *Wethuwamet* had greatly insulted captain *Standish*; bragged much of his great strength, and the sharpness of his knife. His head was taken to Plimouth and exposed upon a gate post of the fort, as was afterwards that of *Metacomet*. A son of *Wethuwamet* they hanged at the same time.

These troubles caused the breaking up of the settlement of *Wessaguscus*, and the murder of several English in retaliation, who had taken up their residence with *Chikataubut's* people.

The history of these affairs afforded the celebrated *Butler* the means of extending the renown of his *Hudibras*, in nearly half the world. See *Tottopotomoi*.

Yotnesh, a Narraganset chief, of note and consequence, in 1637. His name stands next to that of *Canonicus*, upon the instrument conveying the island of *Aquidnek* to the English, and before that of *Miantunnomoh*.

Yumanum, the last Sachem of the Pequots, who lived at Niantic. He died in 1740.
