CENTRAL PRISON BINDER TWINE.

Old Contract Terminated by Notice—More Money in New One.

A statement regarding binder twine contracts at the Central Prison was issued from the provincial secretary's office yesterday. It details contracts made by the old government in 1885, which expired in October 1905, when what was purported to be a new contract, terminable at notice, came into operation. This new contract, which was with the Independent Cordage Company, who had held the old one, was annulled by notice on Nov. 1, and the Colonial Cordage Company arranged with the new government. The statement continues:

"The contract with W. B. Covert's will cause in round numbers a revenue of \$400 per year to the government in excess of the revenue which would have arisen from the binder twine under the Independent Cordage Company. "The convict labor system under which Mr. Covert is operating the twine and rope mill is a new feature introduced by the present government, the binder twine business does not upon the information at the parliament building under the old government since 1885.
