INSURANCE MEN COMMENT ON COMMISSIONERS' REPORT Standard Policy is Objected to, and So, Too, Annual Distribution of Profits. What do insurance men think of the report of the commission?

The local officials will not discuss it, however, their names mentioned along with their comment, which is, of course, only a moral feeling. Canada Life officials, however, are inclined to believe that they've been "jumped on" unreasonably by the commission. A prominent actuary told The World that the commission had wisely refrained from recommending a system of state insurance.

The imposition of penalties on managers and directors whose agents gave rebates would be a fair enough if the agents were acting on the instructions of managers and directors in granting the imposition of penalties when the agents grant rebates, generally to meet the demand of a like nature, and when without the knowledge of the managers and directors? Rebating is, as the commission holds, "dishonest and unrighteous," but no agent is going to give away part of his commission without a good reason. If it is possible to have an act passed which is a criminal offense to offer or accept a rebate, the righteous citizen will not ask for a rebate.

Objections to Standard Policy. "If the policy form issued 20 years ago is to be replaced by the policy issued by any leading company today, it will be seen the conditions have generally materially reduced and the privileges granted to the policyholders very largely increased. The change has been decidedly in favor of the policyholder, each company caused by competition, each company trying to offer the most attractive form of policy. A standard form of policy 20 years ago would have prevented this improvement and would therefore have been a disadvantage to the policyholder. It seems to be not so necessary, and certainly no more desirable to-day. If the present form of policy had been devised and put on the market 20 years ago, there would have been no suggestion that a standard form might be desirable.
