ARMY IMMIGRANTS FOR ONTARIO FARMS

Five Hundred Passengers From
S. S. Southwark Reach
Toronto.

Five hundred immigrants, under the special care of the Salvation Army, reached Toronto on Tuesday. They were passengers on the Southwark and were brought from Montreal by special G. T. R. and C. P. R. trains.

A small contingent of 150 got here about 5:40 p.m., but the large party, about 350, came in on the G. T. R. at 11:30.

Brigadier Howell, Major Morris and the entire immigration staff received the new-comers and soon had them on the way to lodging houses. Buses had been provided for the women and children and they were taken to the Newcomers' Inn on Wellington-street.

Quarters had been prepared for all, who should be provided with food and clothing. A hot supper had been provided for the travelers.

One contingent of domestics, numbering over 30, were placed in the Army Servants' Hostel on Yonge-street, where they will be accommodated until they enter the situations provided for them. Work has been secured for all, the majority entering the service of farmers in New Ontario. The party included many families.

A special feature was a party of 100 Dutchmen, who have come direct under the management of an Army officer.

Over 1000 persons came by the Southwark this trip, all of them Army immigrants. They will be distributed mainly between Ottawa and Toronto. The whole passenger accommodation had been reserved, and this is the fifth exclusive charter that the Army has had on trans-Atlantic boats this season.

Hamilton Happenings

Y.M.C.A. WILL OPEN AN EAST-END BRANCH

By-Law re Laying Double Track on
Main Street Submitted to
Committee.

HAMILTON, May 21.—(Special).—E. W. Babcock, Toronto fruit dealer, formerly of Burlington, was committed for trial at Dundas to-day on the charge of misappropriating \$200 belonging to Dr. Caldwell.

The board of works this evening considered the draft agreement submitted by the Dominion Power and Transmission Company with reference to the double tracking of Main-street from James-street to the terminal station. It provides that the Brandon and Hamilton Railway shall lay the tracks. The by-law was laid over until the city solicitor has a chance to inspect it, as it was feared there might be something in it that might affect the street railway. The legislature will be asked for power to prevent the opening up of gravel pits within the city.

In the future all overhanging signs must be approved of by the city engineer, and the owners must bond indemnifying the city against damage suits.

Council's Rulings.
The finance committee will be asked for enough money to asphalt John-street from King William to Main, Hugheson from King to Main, and Main from Main to York-street.

The city solicitor was asked to report as to the power of the city to compel manufacturers to install smoke consumers.

The Sawney-Massey company's application to build a switch from the T.R. main line will not be opposed. The annual meeting of the Y.M.C.A. was held this evening and it was decided to open an east end branch in the old Barton-street Methodist church which has been purchased at a cost of \$7,000. In his report, Secretary Best regretted that little enthusiasm was shown among the members of the institution. The total receipts amounted to \$12,772 and a surplus of \$11 was shown.

The building fund amounts to \$760 and \$34,600 has been raised for a new boys' building.

J. H. Somerville resigned from the directorate and George C. Copley and Henry New, two new directors were elected, and the following were elected directors: J. C. Dewey, Frederick W. Watkins, W. J. Orr and W. J. Waugh. The membership is now 120.
