THRESHING OLD TOPICS. COUNCIL TALKS OF THE JOHNSON SUIT AND COSTS. All About the City's Responsibility—Presented Against the Reduction of Tax Collectors' Wages—To Investigate Collection of the Unemployed—Vandals in Toronto.

There was a lively discussion upon the following clause of the report of the Board of Control: "Moved by Ald. Preston, seconded by Ald. Hallam, that the City Treasurer be reimbursed Mr. Johnson in costs already incurred, and to aid him in suit against the City of Toronto, in the amount of \$2700 already expended by Mr. Johnson in carrying the suit so far."

MICHIE & CO. HIS BLOOD CALLS FOR VENGEANCE. But No Imprecations—Evidence Came Out at the Martin Inquest—The Jury Agreed the Fatal Spot.

No evidence to show who are the murderers of Joe Martin came out at the inquest conducted by Coroner Dewar at the General Hospital yesterday. The testimony shows that Martin was brutally murdered for his money and valuable, and that the assassins were interrupted before they were able to secure the object of their crime.

Matthew Fraser, a tailor, who lives at 11 Trinity-place, and is a cousin of deceased, testified that Martin was at his house at about 7.30 on Tuesday night, and that he left for the Woodbine. Witness carried much money about him, as he had never heard of about it or even saw it. Martin was a peaceable man, and as far as witness knew, had no enemies and did not carry firearms.

Charles Boyle, the well-known turfman, had known deceased for years, and knew he was in the habit of carrying large sums. He was the first to reach the body of the wounded man after the boy snider had given the alarm. He found Martin so covered with blood that he was unrecognizable.
