## BRIG. GEN. L. W. SHANNON WILL BE RETIRED FROM ACTIVE DUTY PERMANENTLY

G. O. C. of District Receives Unofficial Word to This Effect From Ottawa—Has Been in Service Since 1879.

Brig.-Gen. L. W. Shannon, C. M. G., the general officer commanding Military District No. 1, received an unofficial notification from Ottawa this morning that he will shortly be retired from the active list of the permanent force.

The G. O. C. first joined the Canadian militia as a private in 1879, in No. 1 Company of the 42nd Battalion at Almonte. Then he went to Kingston in 1880, and joined the 14th Battalion, once more as a private.
