

Steamer Boston on her last trip from Boston on Tuesday afternoon last about four o'clock, seven miles from Thatchers Island, observed signals of distress from a dory in the distance. Capt. McKenzie at once changed his course, and ran down to the boat and took on board Frank Fougere, one of the crew of the Gloucester schooner Emeraid, in an exhausted and benumbed condition. He was taken on board by means of a rope tied about his body. The boat, with about 300 pounds of fish, had to be cast adrift. Fougere sad he left his vessel about 1 lo'clock that morning. A stiff gale with mist sprang up, and he drifted away from his vessel. Had he not been rescued just as he was re could not have survived many hours longer and must have perished. Upon his arrival here American Consul Creevey took charge of him, and after supplying necessary clothing and food, sent him to Boston by steamer Boston the same evening.—Yarmouth Telegram.
