**POPE'S ENCYCLICAL ON BILINGUAL QUESTION**  
Some interviews in Ottawa and Montreal on the Matter

Ottawa, Oct. 27.—Various interpretations are placed upon a letter of Pope Benedict addressed to Cardinal Beaudry. The general impression is, however, that the letter is an intimation that bilingual and other agitations should cease.

Samuel Genest, head of the bilingual agitation in Ottawa, does not appear to consider that he should be deterred by the letter from continuing the agitation. He says that it is not a matter of dogma, and that the French-Canadians are only demanding their rights, and that he does not intend to lie down and give up because of any warning. He goes further than the Holy Father and demands that not only all bishops be French, but that all French-Canadians learn French.

Senator Belcourt would say little beyond intimating that the letter is a call to tolerance and moderation and that it would accomplish a good purpose.

Calmer in Montreal

Montreal, Que., Oct. 27.—The encyclical of His Holiness the Pope regarding the bilingual question is much commented on privately by the French-speaking people, but that they desire on their part to say anything for publication.

It is pointed out that what is published in many respects a summary of the encyclical, translated from the Latin into English and then into French, and that there are some phrases which may have had their meaning changed. It is believed the official organ of the archbishop, "La Semaine Religieuse," will publish the encyclical in French and that it will be followed by the sending of full copies to every parish priest, with instructions to read it from the pulpit on a certain date.

There is one paragraph which is particularly of interest, in which the Catholic newspapers are told not to do anything to fan the flame of discord or to anticipate the judgment of the church, and further that "the faithful also should avoid discussing the subject in public meetings so-called, because it is impossible to keep party spirit out of such discussion."

Meant to Educate

Victor Morin, the president of the St. Jean Baptiste Society, regarded this as an advice and not an order, and that while as a Catholic he had no judgment to pass on the Pope's letter, yet on general lines his sentiment, and that of the society he represented was that, far from arousing a spirit of setting one party against another, their policy was to make the question better known to both parties, believing that by so doing there would be a better understanding between them. As to the facts of the question, the society had advocated that the two languages should be taught. They were not adverse to the teaching of English, far from it—they wanted it taught and well taught in the schools, but they also wanted the children to learn the language they spoke in their families.

Mr. Morin considered the advice of the Pope wise, in order to prevent intemperate discussions, holding that quiet exposition of the question without appeals to passion was the best way to make the situation known and that was the only way it should be stated before the public. The newspapers took sides, and

both sides were to blame, for they went too far and distorted the attempts of the people to bring about good feeling. Catholics would be quite ready to submit to any directions the Pope might give, and if he should direct that no meetings be held, he would be obeyed, although at present it was not understood in that way.

The president of the Association Catholique de la Jeunesse, Dr. Guy Boyce, said that the president he would like to meet his friends before issuing any statement as to the attitude of the association. The secretary of the society also refused to speak.

## PERFECTS PROCESS TO UTILIZE MILL WASTE

Byproducts Are Produced Profitably; Marketable Output of Considerable Quantity

Dr. J. G. Davidson of the University of British Columbia, in co-operation with the Vancouver saw plant and the industrial chemistry of the University of Washington, has discovered a process of distilling sawmill waste whereby it is believed that thousands of dollars now lost will be saved.

By means of this process, a light oil, acetone line and charcoal are formed. The gas produced by distillation is carried through a pipe nine inches in diameter and twenty feet long. The gas is an electrically charged vapor, which causes precipitation of the heavy particles of tar. The tar, forty gallons for each cord of wood distilled, is of medium consistency and immediately marketable. The light oil, obtained in a water condenser, is immediately marketable for use in refining, and the yield is twelve gallons to the cord of wood. Eighty pounds of acetone are obtained from the pyrolytic gas, and each cord of wood. Nine hundred pounds of charcoal are the final byproducts.

Dr. Davidson has been working on the problem of simplifying the distilling of wood and coal by the process indicated above for more than two years. The greater part of the work has been done in the Vancouver saw plant and the Tacoma gas works, and the facts discovered in these two plants were utilized last summer in a series of experimental runs lasting for about a month.

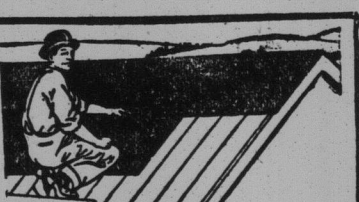
